

Foreword

The NZ Organic Library Stock Wine Awards (Vintage wine awards) was a launched in 2018 as a proof of concept, to both discover without doubt how certain wines are ageing, and to then promote the cellaring potential of these wines to consumers.

The concept proved popular among wineries, with higher than expected entrance rates for the inaugural awards. As far as I can deduce we are the only organisation within nz (or potentially wider) to attempt a standalone library stock (or vintage specific) award.

Our immediate plans are to seek feedback from those who participated in the awards, and other wineries in order to refine the format and improve upon this next year.

This year we exclusively judged 2013 vintage wines, which was 5 years after the current release. We received 45 enties from 17 wineries. 2013 was a challenging, yet rewarding vintage for most, experiencing higher temperatures and more sunshine than usual, whilst receiving above average rainfall, especially early in the season.

Wines were judged as per the NZ Organic Wine Awards standard scoring criteria and then awarded a corroponding star rating (to differentiate these from the main NZ Organic Wine Awards accolades). A far higher proportion of wines were awarded than our mainstrean award, especially at the higher end of the scale (5 star). we attribute this to both the increased maturity of the wines, but also the competing wineries being more selective about which wines they enter.

Observations

Pinot Noir

Pinot Noir is really the flagship varietal for the Library Stock Awards. This is the class for which the success of the concept will ultimately be judged, as well as the largest category. All of the wines sampled are ageing well and have matured nicely in bottle. Our judges felt some were reaching their peak, while others would continue to improve over the coming years. 2013 tended to provide lower yields for typical PN growing regions, although the remaining fruit was deemed to be of exceptional quality. Our champion Pinot Noir is the 'Domaine-Thomson "Surveyor Thomson" Single Vineyard Pinot Noir'.

Chardonnay

Chardonnay was the Library stock awards second highest largest class. Judges responded well to the the entries, awarding two five star ratings, and two four star ratings. Our champion Chardonnay is Rock Ferry's Corners Vineyard Chardonnay.

Riesling

We saw a good number of riesling entries from both Waipara and Otago. Overall the category performed well. Some of the bottles had developed a 'fizz' which we put down to an early harvest due to above average temperatues. Whilst not deemed a flaw by our judges, this may limit percieved complexity during judging.

Our champion Riesling is 'Carrick's Bannockburn Riesling'.

Sauvignon Blanc

Not a typically cellared vintage, although the increasing populatity of ML/Oaked sauvignon's will surely increase the potential for this varietal. The most sucessful SB's had retained a citrus spark, while being balanced with a creamy mouthfeel.

The champion Sauvignon Blanc is 'Rock Ferry Corners Vineyard Sauvignon Blanc'

Alternative white wines

Alternative whites did not fair as well as we have seen with the mainstream organic wine awards. Some of this may be that the vines for the 2013 vintage were particularly young, or in conversion in 2013. One exception is Quartz Reef's Methode Traditionnelle Vintage 2013 Blanc de Blancs which obtained gold, and our Sparkling champion.
